POST OPERATIVE GUIDELINES

ENDOMETRIAL RESECTION/ ABLATION

- 1. Most women feel well enough to return to normal work and daily activities after a few days but we do recommend taking one week off work.
- 2. You can expect to have a vaginal loss for a few weeks. This may range from a watery loss to moderate bleeding.
- 3. Please use pads and not tampons for the first 2-3 weeks..
- 4. Please avoid intercourse for at least two weeks.
- 5. No strenuous exercise or activity for a week.
- 6. Bath or shower as usual. No swimming for at least 2 weeks.
- 7. You may take analgesics for crampy pain. (Panadol/ Panadeine etc.)
- 8. If there are any problems, please page me on 9387 1000, or phone me on 9776 6411 or 0418 543 453.

- a) Severe pain.
- b) Very heavy bleeding, especially clots and flooding.
- c) Fever
- d) Offensive vaginal odour.
- 9. Please arrange a review appointment with me in about six weeks time.
- 10. This procedure will certainly reduce fertility but will not guarantee contraception, therefore this must be considered.
